



The Weymouth Wizard



Thank you for travelling on the "Weymouth Wizard" today. From Bristol Temple Meads, Chippenham and Trowbridge to Dorchester and Weymouth. We are scheduled to arrive in Dorchester (West) at 11:32 and Weymouth at 11:45.

Your return train leaves Weymouth Station at 17:28 (5.28 p.m)

and Dorchester West at 17:40. Please arrive at the station a few minutes earlier. It is scheduled to arrive in Chippenham at 19:49, Swindon at 20:05 and Bristol Temple Meads at 20:54.

Alternative return trains **to Chippenham and Swindon** leave Weymouth at 16:08, 18:28 and 20:21 – but you'll need to change trains at Westbury and (on the 18:28) Castle Cary too. You can also return at these times to Bristol, but that's using a bus from Westbury to Bath Spa.

If you enjoy your trip today, please tell your friends and come along again. This train runs every Saturday in August 2015 at 08:16 from Bristol, 08:59 from Swindon and 09:14 from Chippenham. Organised and operated by First Great Western, supported by the TransWilts Community Rail Partnership and the Heart of Wessex Partnership.

Today's journey turns off the main Bristol line just to the West of Chippenham and takes you down the valley of the River Avon past Melksham to Trowbridge and on to Westbury, where you can see one of Wiltshire's chalk White Horses overlooking the town. This is the TransWilts line.

Every week of the year, seven days a week, TransWilts trains make this journey from Swindon and Chippenham to Melksham, Trowbridge and Westbury. Onward connections to Salisbury, Southampton, Portsmouth, Frome, Yeovil, Taunton, Exeter and the West of England make this route a great way to head south – be it for a leisure trip, on business, or as your regular commute. And the adult fare from Swindon to Westbury is as low as £7.10 (off peak day return).

Leaving Westbury, the line passes through Somerset and then traverses the Dorset Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, before sweeping over the South Dorset Downs to the World Heritage Jurassic Coast at Weymouth. This is the Heart of Wessex Line

Heart of Wessex trains run all year between Weymouth and Westbury, with most trains carrying on to Bath Spa and Bristol Temple Meads. There are around 8 trains each way per day, with fewer on Sundays in Winter.

You can reach over 2,500 different stations in Great Britain by trains from Swindon and Chippenham – from short journeys to Oxford, Reading, South Wales, Melksham and Salisbury through to big cities such as London, Birmingham, Leeds, Manchester, Glasgow and Edinburgh to far flung spots like Helmsdale and Mallaig, St Ives and Great Yarmouth, and Gunnislake and Great Malvern.
